

Approved market application

This application form should be used by organisers of low-risk markets who want to have their market added to the Commissioner's approved markets list.

There are a number of factors the Commissioner will consider when assessing whether a market is low risk to the public and whether it should be included in the approved markets list, including:

- if the market is a regular ongoing event (one-off events will require a short-term liquor licence)
- if the event is ticketed (such events will require a short-term liquor licence)
- when the market will be held (i.e. daytime or nighttime)
- the risk profile of the location
- the risk profile of the potential crowd.

To help the Commissioner assess your application, please ensure you include a detailed description of your market in the application form. For a list of markets already approved by the Commissioner please refer to the [approved markets](#) list.

Please note that endorsements cannot be granted for events held at venues that already hold a liquor licence.

It is also important that market organisers communicate with their local council to ensure they have no objection to liquor being sold or supplied at the market by local producers.

Why do markets require approval?

The Commissioner is responsible for regulating the sale and supply of liquor in South Australia. If you would like local liquor producers to attend your market to sell, supply or otherwise sample their liquor products – they can only do so if they have an endorsement on their licence authorising them to sell or supply liquor at approved markets.

A liquor production and sales licence can be endorsed with an authorisation to sell or supply liquor at approved markets for consumption on (e.g. sampling or seated at a table) or consumption off (takeaway sales in sealed containers) the site of the market. Such licences are typically held by local producers of wine, beer, gin or other spirits.

If a licensee wants to sell or supply liquor at a low-risk event, such as a local market, they can apply for an event endorsement to be placed on their licence, authorising them to sell or supply liquor at any market on the approved markets list. Licensees will also typically enter into an agreement with the market organiser to sell or supply liquor at their market.
