

Selling Tobacco?

Don't sell to under 18 year olds

No ID No sale - under 18

By law a tobacco retailer or their employee must ask for proof of age identification if there is any doubt that a purchaser of tobacco is 18 years or older. Always ask to see **photographic identification**. Using the date of birth on the **purchaser's ID** is an easy way to confirm a person's age.

If the current year is: **Legal to sell** - if the purchaser's birthday is on or before today's date in this year
